Educational Opportunities

Throughout the year, the MCO program offers its members educational opportunities through which they can continue to learn and hone their leadership and governing skills.

The educational opportunities include:

MCO Summer Conference:

Each summer mayors and vice-mayors gather for a 3-day conference that includes educational, networking and social activities. The conference is held each year in a different location across the state.

OML Annual Conference:

Each year, during the annual three-day OML conference, the mayors and vice-mayors participate in a special mayor's educational track of workshops aimed at focusing on the issues most important and beneficial to them.



Educational Opportunities

Mayor Mentor Program:

This program is for mayors that have been in office for less than one year; be desirous of gaining knowledge from a more experienced mayor; be available to meet in person with your mentor a minimum of one time; and, be prepared to make a new friend who shares common concerns for their community.





Educational Opportunities

Certified Mayors Program:

This program was created for the purpose of providing mayors and vice-mayors an opportunity to develop their skills in municipal government knowledge, community leadership, and current trends that are impacting the local community. This is a voluntary program that requires a total of 40 credit hours of training needed for certification.



Legislative Advocacy

Congress of Mayors:

Each year, MCO sponsors this day-long event at the state capitol. The purpose is to give mayors and vice-mayors an opportunity to experience the legislative process in action.

Legislative Reception:

This annual event is a great opportunity for networking between municipal officials and Oklahoma legislators.

Mayors-on-Call program:

When critical legislation is pending at the capitol, mayors are contacted so that they can immediately contact their legislators to support or oppose the legislation.
